1. What does Moses mean when he said Job cursed the day? Job 3:1:1-5

2. What is Job really questioning? Job 3:11

3. Where does life come from? Job 33:4. Who alone has the choice over life, when it ends and why? Job 33:18

4. Who was Job responding to in chapter 3? (Job 2:11) How long did Job wait to speak to them? Job 2:13

5. (Discussion) What could be shared with someone who is cursing the day and questioning their very existence in the light of the book of Job?

MONDAY: October 24

Key Passage(s): Job 3:11-26

1. How does Job understand death after one gives “up the ghost”? Job 3:11-13

2. What is the ghost or the life giving spirit God puts within us? Job 27:9

3. In considering Job’s statement about resting in the grave, do the living have knowledge, do they have a reward, or do they have love, hate, and envy? What about those that give up the spirit and die? Ecclesiastes 9:5,6

4. When he is to die, how does he describe that state of death? Job 7:21

5. (Discussion) Should Christians be watching or listening to anything that teaches the devil's oldest lie in the Bible “ye shall not surely die”?

1. How does Job feel about the trials that he is going through? Job 6:2, 3

2. How did God look at the trial of Job? Job 1:8; Job 2:3

3. What New Testament principle is Job not realizing he is experiencing? 1Corinthians 10:13

4. What is the purpose of trials? 1Peter 1:7; James 1:2-4

5. How should a Christian take the trials of life? 1Peter 4:12

6. (Discussion) What do, non self-inflicted trials say about an individual? 2Timothy 3:12

Key Passage(s): Job 7:1-11

1. What did Job want in the midst of his sufferings? Job 7:1-4

2. How was Job feeling? Job 7:7

3. In the darkest of times why should we always have hope? Jeremiah 17:7; Job 19:25

4. As his anguish reaches the point of desiring death, Job's anguish bring some wonderful truths about the state of man in dead. What does he teach us about death? Job 7:8-10

5. (Discussion) Why is it so different for us during sufferings to trust in the Lord? How can looking at "the big picture" help through life's tragedies?

4. What is the marginal reading for 'an expected end'? in Jeremiah 29:11

5. (Concluding Thoughts) Why can we have hope in the midst of our trials and sufferings? Hebrews 4:14-16
